Receiving his Bachelor of Arts degree from Kansas State University, Bud Hall has performed graduate studies in history and law at Kansas State and the University of Virginia and is now Senior Managing Director for The Fairfax Group, a global security and investigative firm specializing in conducting complex internal inquiries for multinational companies, major law firms and sovereign governments.

He previously served as Global Security Director for General Electric while managing a large-budget security program. In this capacity, Mr. Hall chaired the Security Council, served as Crisis Management Leader, and Business Compliance Officer. In addition, he has served as an advisor to the U.S. Department of Homeland Security and the Department of State on global investigative matters.

Prior to service with GE, he enjoyed a distinguished career with the U.S. Congress as a criminal investigations manager, during which time he served as Chief Investigator for the U.S. House of Representatives Iran/Contra Committee. Further, Mr. Hall performed sensitive internal investigations for the U.S. Senate Ethics, Armed Services, Justice and Intelligence Committees. Prior to Congressional service, seventeen years was spent with the FBI, wherein he managed nationwide organized crime investigations, serving as Unit Chief, Organized Crime Section, FBI Headquarters. He is qualified as an expert witness in U.S. District Court.

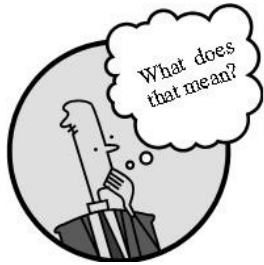
Clark "Bud" Hall has written and lectured widely on cavalry operations in the American Civil War. He is a co-founder and past board member of the Chantilly Battlefield Association; Association for the Preservation of Civil War Sites, Inc; and the Brandy Station Foundation. Presented with numerous battlefield preservation commendations, including the distinguished, "Ralph A. Happel Battlefield Preservation Award," by the Central Virginia Battlefields Trust (2011), he also just received the Edwin C. Bearss Lifetime Achievement Award (2012) for his preservation efforts at Chantilly Battlefield as well as becoming the founder of the Brandy Station Foundation, which defeated development schemes for a Formula One racetrack proposed for the battlefield.

Mr. Hall is a decorated Marine combat veteran, who served in Viet Nam as a tactical commander and resides in Middleburg, Virginia.

Antebellum: A term often used to describe the United States of America before the outbreak of the Civil War.

Barbette: Raised platform or mound allowing an artillery piece to be fired over a fortification's walls without exposing the gun crew to enemy fire.

Breastworks: Barriers which were about breast-high and protected soldiers from enemy fire.

Brevet: An honorary promotion in rank, usually for merit. Officers did not usually function at or receive pay for their brevet rank.

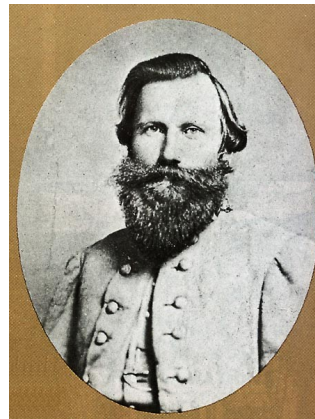
