He participated in the Atlanta campaign attached to the 1st Division Artillery, 15th Army Corps, Army of the Tennessee thru 1864. Family oral history indicates that he participated in Sherman's March to the Sea, however numerous Civil War Records indicate that the battery did not make the cut when Sherman reduced his forces in Atlanta for his famous march and the Battery was involved in the pursuit of Hood into Alabama, support of Thomas in Chattanooga and Nashville, Tenn. then returned to St. Louis, Mo. in June, 1865

Mustered out: Aug. 3(1?), 1865 Last paid to: Aug 31.1864

Clothing account: due U.S.: \$45.11?

Bounty Paid: \$140; due: \$160

Post War:

He applied for a pension in 1890 due to "deafness as a result of cannonading" while on duty at Atlanta, Ga.
